- Everyone must comply with no flying on the pits side of the runway, including out towards the entrance to the park.
- All fly-bys must be on the far side of the runway.
- No one is allowed past the flight stations unless all aircraft are on the ground. The exception is if your plane's engine/motor quits and your plane is on the runway, you may call "On the Runway". The person making the call needs to ensure everyone has heard him/her before proceeding onto the runway.
