New Business:

• Duane opened a discussion regarding our pylon racing, more specifically T-28 pylon racing. With the T-28 becoming scarce, he's exploring the feasibility of using other 1.1-meter warbirds to use. The primary criteria is that they must use 3S 2200-mah batteries. One issue is on how to limit the speed in order to make the aircraft comparable and relying on pilot skill. Another issue is to ensure that the motors, ESC, and props are all the same, regardless of the airframe used. Please reach out to Duane for any inputs/recommendations you may have to ensure that the racing is equitable.
